Welcome to LYF!

Leading Youth Forward (LYF) is a youth development non-profit focused on empowering today's youth to become conscientious, proactive, and effective leaders, while fostering awareness of the Taiwanese American identity and culture. We accomplish this through our annual youth summer camp: **LYF Camp.**

What happens at camp?

LYF Camp is an exciting 6 day, 5 night affair, jampacked with interactive leadership workshops, collaborative teamwork exercises, and both traditional and cultural camp activities.

Workshops



Workshops explore the different themes of what it means to be an effective and giving leader, such as passion, empathy, patience, and courage. We teach our campers important life skills and encourage them to examine the person they want to be and the impact they can make on our communities.

Clinics



Clinics are activities for campers to discover and nurture their interests in sports, science, arts, and culture. Every year, we host over 60 clinics, including:

- · Water bottle rockets
- Hip hop dance
- A capella
- Crayon melting
- ...and more!

Traditional American



Camp would not be complete without the fixings of the traditional American summer camp: singing camp songs into the night, hiking through the camp grounds, roasting marshmallows by the fire, just to name a few.

An additional flair of Taiwanese culture makes camp a distinct experience in itself - enjoy a refreshing bowl of tsua-bing on a hot summer day, snack on bahtzang or dou hua at our Taiwanese Night Market, and much more!


What's in it for you?

Counselors

Counselors lead their groups of kids through camp, but also inspire, nurture, and build the proper environment for activities. (educational and thoughtful for workshops, encouraging for clinics, high-spirited and fun for large group activities)

Synthesis

Synthesis team members keep camp running through their execution of camp logistics, setup, and clean up - delivering a smooth transition from one activity to the next - and can participate in all workshops, activities, and clinics as desired.

Media

Media team members capture camp's special moments through photography and videography, while participating in all aspects of camp as desired.

1 Complete your staff application ASAP (click here)

- + This application should take around 30-60 minutes to complete and is critical in helping us assess your fit to determine which role and, if applicable, co-counselor, will best suit your talents and needs
- + We need all applications turned in before Friday, February 27th, but we highly encourage you to submit earlier, so we can onboard you sooner and because our staff numbers directly impact the number of campers we can accept

2 We'll contact you for a brief, informal interview

+ We want to use this time to get to know you better, understand how we can help you get the most out of camp, and answer any questions you may have regarding camp responsibilities and logistics

3 Attend our meetings to prep and our socials to play!

- + We have three mandatory meetings in order to fully prepare you for camp:
 - + February Introductory meeting / sign-up to lead clinics
 - + March Workshop walk-through
 - + May Camp weekend retreat
- + Be on the lookout for emails and Facebook posts about our regular socials, ranging from dinners to hiking to snowboarding!

Is camp free for me if I am a staff member?

Yes, camp is absolutely free for staff!

It actually costs LYF over \$400 per staff member (lodging, meals, apparel, etc.), but because we value the hard work and dedication each and every staff member puts into LYF, our Board works tirelessly throughout the year to fundraise and subsidize staff fees.

What is the time commitment expected of a staff member?

At the minimal, a staff member is expected to attend our three mandatory meetings which will help prepare you for the wonderful craziness that is camp and ensure you get the most out of your camp experience. And of course, attend camp!

However, like many things in life, the more you put into camp, the more you get out of it. Ask any of our returning staff members – taking on a leadership role in any capacity, such as crafting a clinic or leading an activity or just giving 110% of your love and attention to your campers, will pay off in a big way.

I am not currently in the Bay Area and cannot attend the meetings in person. Can I still do camp?

Of course! If you want to be a part of camp, and honestly, why wouldn't you, we will make sure you are!

As it is critical that you are relayed the same information and trainings that our other staff receive, we will hold separate conference calls via phone or videochat for all non-local staff to ensure they're up to date on all things camp related.

Do I have to be 100% certain I can attend camp before getting involved?

Not at all - we understand that not everyone's summer plans are set in stone and can change depending on conflicts such as summer school, internships, and family vacations. If you are interested in LYF, we encourage you to jump right in with camp planning and staff socials. The experience will be meaningful even if you unfortunately cannot attend camp. Please let us know your availability and what factors might change your attendance so we can keep track of our staff numbers.
